
Sadly Ted, a former Mayor of Lewes, died on October 6.


Southern Chapter Crab Feast





AHS&TC Enclave 2024 in Ocean City, NJ September 15-19, 2024

The Austin-Healey Sports& Touring Club is a regional club based around the Philadelphia area. An annual event termed "Encounter" is held in September. This year the meeting was held in Ocean City, NJ at the Flanders Hotel, an historic venue located on the Boardwalk. From September 15th through the 19th. This event was titled "Back to the Boardwalk" as it was a repeat of the previous event held in 2019. Having previously participated in 2019, we looked forward to another four days on the Boardwalk.

The weather forecast was dire: predicting rain —heavy at times starting Tuesday and continuing through Thursday. The forecast, along with a flat tire on Friday before — led us to forego taking the Healey. I had experienced a rain soaked Lewes Car show in May and had no desire to repeat the experience — driving a topless car in the rain



is not fun. However, we had already booked the hotel and the Ferry from Lewes to Cape May so we pushed on using our minivan (much more comfortable in the rain!). The ride over on the Ferry was a little rough but at least the sun was shining. It is about a 40 minute drive north to Ocean City from Cape May using the Garden State Parkway.



On Monday we participated in the Rally which started from the Hotel and ended at the Cape May airport. The route took us through the backroads of southern New Jersey and last about 1½ hours. Along the way we had to identify items per the clues provided in the rally instructions. Unlike the previous event, we did not get lost this time. After finishing the rally, we toured the Wildwood Naval Air Station Museum. This facility is located outside of Cape May at the Cape May Airport and was a training base for WWII naval pilots. A large hanger contains displays of various aircraft from WWII planes to modern day jets and helicopters. Located next to the Museum is the Flight Deck Diner where we had lunch.

That evening there was a Wine & Cheese Reception and Charity auction where the Club

auctioned of Healey based memorabilia and raised \$4500 for the Ronald McDonald House Charity of Philadelphia.

Things got a little jumbled on Tuesday. The Encounter 2024 Car Show was moved from Wednesday to Tuesday due to the predicted rain for the rest of the week. The cars are lined up and then driven down the Boardwalk and parked for display. This year there were only about 30 participants but the weather held off and the show was a success. That evening we had a Southern BBQ Buffet at the hotel followed by Valve Cover races. This involved valves covers – mostly from the 4 Cylinder cars – to which skateboard type wheels were added and the covers then elaborately decorated. A wooden ramp is used and the covers were raced two by two until a winner was declared.



Wednesday turned out to be free day so we walked the Boardwalk for a while. We also walked over to the Ocean City Life Saving Station



which, unfortunately, was closed. That evening, after a cocktail reception, we attend the Encounter 2024 Awards banquet. The theme of the Banquet was the Roaring Twenties and participants were encouraged to dress for that period. At the end of the evening the Georg Null Award for the Club Member of the Year was given to Chuck Ott (Chuck has participated in a number of the BCCD events).

Thursday was checkout and a drive to Cape May for the ferry ride back to Lewes. After all of the concern about rain, there was none. The ferry ride back was calm and sunny. Next year Encounter 2025 will be held at the Camelback Lodge & Resort in the Poconos – we will see what the weather brings.




